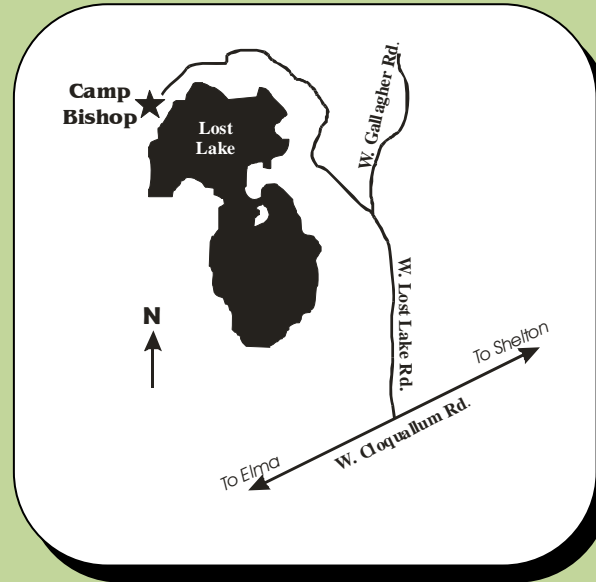

Resident Camp

The YMCA Resident Camping Program encourages cooperation, tolerance and teamwork within a group living environment. Campers are assigned cabins according to their age and gender. The values of honesty, caring, respect, and responsibility are at the core of every activity. Camp chores and camp activities are decided and undertaken as a cabin group, however, campers also have the option of signing up for activities independent of their cabin.

Campers sleep in cabins with bunk beds. One counselor and one assistant are assigned to each cabin group. The YMCA's camper to staff ratio is six to one.

Campers are all skill tested for swimming ability shortly after arrival. This is all accomplished in a non-threatening, positive manner. Every effort is made to make your child feel comfortable and welcome at Camp Bishop.
